Available in indigenous languages Akawaio and Wapishan, this literary gem serves as a powerful tool for environmental education and cultural preservation.

In a bold move towards leveraging technology for environmental advocacy, Policy Forum Guyana has included Litta Reporta in its publications. Though the app was not created by Policy Forum Guyana, it represents a revolutionary solution to Guyana's solid waste disposal problems. To create a cleaner, greener future, citizens can report dumpsites and coordinate cleanup efforts using this easy-to-use application.

Committed to fostering informed stewardship, Policy Forum Guyana has partnered with the University of British Columbia to develop informative infographics spotlighting the iconic Bangamary fish. These visually engaging posters provide crucial insights into the fish's diet, habitat, and threats, inspiring action to safeguard its dwindling population.
